Health Insurance	Exchange students are obliged to arrange for sufficient health insurance coverage during their study period.		
	You can apply for an EHIC/GHIC card which enables you to obtain medical assistance for free when abroad. If you are an EU passport holder you will be able to use your EHIC card when travelling to an EU country. If you are a UK passport holder and/or do not have an EU passport, please read the information about how to apply for a UK GHIC card . As a BU student, you can apply for your EHIC/GHIC card using the BU Letter Request Form .		
	Please note that some partners may request that incoming students purchase additional health insurance to comply with their immigration and institutional requirements.

Visas & Permits	When travelling to Denmark you must consider what document(s) you will need to enter the country and commence your studies or research at Aarhus. This will depend on the country you are travelling from, your home citizenship, the length of your stay in Denmark, and the purpose of your stay in Denmark amongst other criteria.		
	Please make sure to understand what is needed and secure this in time before you travel and that you have an up-to-date passport that expires no earlier than 6 months after you intend to return.		
	Exchange students with a non-EEA nationality will receive a letter of acceptance after the application deadlines to start their application through the Danish Embassy.
