Health Insurance	You will be responsible for your own medical and dental costs during your stay in Hong Kong. You are therefore required to take out an appropriate travel and health insurance scheme.		
	In addition to the <u>University Health Services</u> (UHS) provided by PolyU and the public medical services, PolyU has also arranged a Group Personal Accident Insurance for all PolyU registered students. The insurance only covers bodily injury occurs during activities organized by PolyU. Therefore, all exchange students must enrol in an appropriate insurance plan to protect themselves in case of accidents and they will be requested to provide a copy of the Insurance certificate and policy before departure from home. The insurance plan should cover the entire exchange period with the start date and end date matching the student's flight departure date/return flight arrival date and the following items:		
	 Medical expenses (including out-patient, hospital expenses and accident) Personal accident (as the result of any illness, injury, disability or accident) Personal liability covering the legal liability of causing the death of a third party or property damage due to negligence Emergency medical evacuation and repatriation of remains (due to accident/illness/other causes). 		
Travel Insurance	BU offers a comprehensive <u>BU travel cover</u> to all outgoing students. after reviewing BU's travel cover, and depending on personal considerations or specific health issues, some students might decide to purchase an additional insurance policy to top-up what is available.		
	Please note that BU Travel Cover is updated every August.		
Visas & Permits	When travelling to Hong Kong you must consider what document(s) you will need to enter the country and commence your studies or research at HKPU. This will depend on the country you are travelling from, your home citizenship, the length of your stay in Hong Kong, and the purpose of your stay in Hong Kong amongst other criteria.		
	Please make sure to understand what is needed and secure this in time before you travel and that you have an up-to-date		

	passport that expires no earlier than 6 months after you intend to return.		
	Support for your visa application will be provided by the HKPU. Once you have been nominated to the partner university, an invitation (a token) will be sent to you via email to make and application. You will be required to complete the online application with supporting documents uploaded, any administrative fees paid and dispatch or send by express post to Global Engagement Office (GEO) for HKPU to handle.
